I always give hints on how to improve the score in case you might want to take the test again although, scoring a 7 on Analytical Listening is darn GOOD! So...to improve you need to listen for lack of tuning caused by verticality of tonal line and unmatched vowels; dropped phrase endings caused by tight-throated singing; and, besides work on individual vocal production, the best sequence of skill development for that particular chorus in sound is accurate notes and intervals, tuning, synchronization,, chord balancing. Must have the right notes and intervals before anything else can "come together".
