Lynette,

I'm sorry that I have not a chance to view your directing video until today. I have been in and out of town (mostly out, only been home 1 night) for more than 2 weeks and am now just getting a chance to view this, in fact I am at the hotel in Birmingham for SS.

I will send your score to Patty Leveille, the combination of this score and your other scores will determine if you qualify for Certified Director and Patty will notify you of your score. Are you an assistant director in Harmony Hills? I need to put that on your form.

In the Directing Skill, there are 10 directing skills that are evaluated and they are:

- Demonstrates understanding of ictus through appropriate breaths and downbeats
- 2. Demonstrates ability to keep a steady tempo in an uptune
- 3. Demonstrates *rubato* technique appropriate to the interpretation of a barbershop ballad
- 4. Demonstrates ability to indicate attacks and releases clearly
- 5. Exhibits congruency between mouth posture and hand motions
- 6. Exhibits body posture appropriate for good singing
- 7. Avoids body posture distractions
- 8. Maintains eye contact with the performing unit
- 9. Exhibits facial posture appropriate for expressive singing
- 10. Demonstrates ability to communicate dynamics effectively

You are evaluated in a scale of 1-5 (5 being highest)

Here are the skill areas that I believe you need work on:

- #1 Demonstrates understanding of the ictus Your ictus did not seemed to be established in the ballad, sometimes it was at chest level and sometimes it was at your waist. Not having a consistent ictus can effect attacks and releases because it is not in the same place. There were a couple of places on the ballad where some of the singers did not cut-off with you. Your ictus was much better and more consistent in the uptune.
- #2 Demonstrates ability to keep steady tempo in an uptune. This skill was pretty good, I think you lost tempo on the uptune because a couple of your release and attacks were not in tempo.
- #3 Demonstrates rubato technique appropriate to the interpretation of a barbershop ballad You were using a lot of circular motions with your arms and the circles were coming towards the singers which makes them difficult to follow and not well defined. At the beginning of the ballad the chorus was not all following your interpretation of the phrase "I can't think or do a thing without your love".

#4 - Demonstrates ability to indicate attacks and releases clearly - this was your weakest skill. Several of your releases were not definite and your palms were down which makes it hard for the singer to follow and as I stated in #1 there were a couple of issues with a couple singers not releasing with you.

#6 & 7 were pretty good, your body was bouncing somewhat on the uptune and that can be a distraction

You did a very good job maintaining eye contact with the chorus and I loved the joyful expression on your face throughout.
