## CHORUS BUDDY STATUS

Ohio Heartland—They still do not use ZOOM or any other technological communication system. We did set up a ZOOM visit in June, and they had 7 members present. At this time they continue to have a written monthly newsletter and telephone the members for announcements and birthday wishes.

Spirit of Evansville—They had been using ZOOM to conduct weekly meetings, and were grateful to the Region for this service. They have begun meeting in person in a park with social distancing and masks for singing and socialization with about 14 members present and are no longer using ZOOM.
